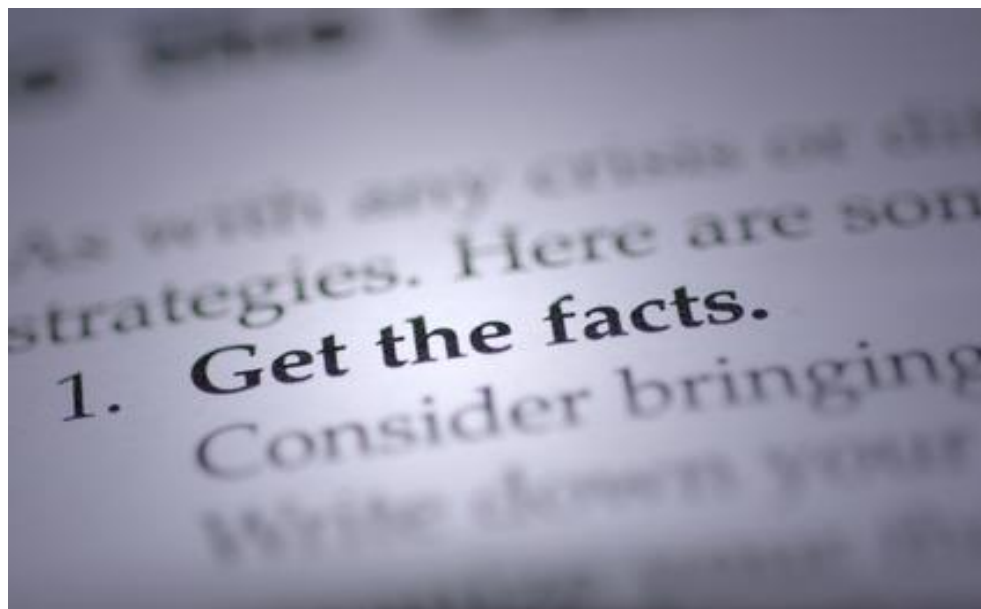

EUROPEAN MASTER IN PROJECT MANAGEMENT – EUROMPM – GENERAL MANAGEMENT 3 OR 4 SEMESTER CONTENT AND STRUCTURE

Degree Programme Profile

The degree programme is a consecutive application-oriented degree programme. Accordingly, admission requires a first graduate degree imparting professional skills (bachelor's degree or (German) Diplom). The criteria for an application-oriented degree programme are met both with regard to content and by the lecturers' quality as these have experience in the job-specific application of academic findings in addition to their academic qualification.

The relevant profile elements are:

- focus on the application area project management
- investigation and development of project management as an academic field
- communication of the interdisciplinary and cross-domain character of project management through the selection of modules and specialisations and by integrating several disciplines in Dortmund and at partner institutions.
- the international focus with the integration in a network of renowned European universities
- the high share of practical and project-related work in the curriculum, both by the elements of the course modules throughout the semester and by the independent work dominating the third and fourth semesters; this profile element is reinforced by the cooperation of lecturers from the industry with long-term associations with the University of Applied Sciences and Arts
- consolidation of the academic element by integration in F&E activities of the universities via the project thesis and the specialization
- the 4-semester master's programme EuroMPM-IT-4semesters also offered by the University of Applied Sciences and Arts is complemented by the IT and technology oriented profile element

The programme qualifies for senior managerial work in projects in companies, associations or authorities

Completing the degree programme *European Master in Project Management – EuroMPM* leads to a highly qualifying degree, both academically and professionally. It prepares for senior managerial work in projects in companies, associations or authorities and teaches students the required skills, abilities and methods. In order to meet the demands and changes of the professional world, teaching of the contents of the individual modules is application-oriented and based on academic findings. Students are thus enabled to analyse processes and problems encountered in practice and to work out appropriate professional solutions while taking into account the context of other fields.

In addition to the acquisition of subject-specific and methodological competences, the students' personal and social skills are to be developed. Students acquire professional skills and are capable to take responsible action. International competences can be improved by studying at one of the foreign universities involved for a minimum of one semester.

The contents of the programme take into account the profiles of requirements of the international associations for project management (PMI®, IPMA®, GPM). The international focus is provided by English being used as the language of instruction and also by the possibility to study abroad. The standard period of study including all examinations is three semesters or, if studies are extended by a semester abroad, four semesters.

The Master *Euro MPM* thus leads to 120 ECTS for the four-semester programme and to 90 ECTS for the three-semester programme.

The degree programme was developed by representatives of various European Universities and is offered at the following universities in parallel:

- Norwegian University of Science and Technology – NTNU – in Trondheim, Norway
- University of the Basque Country in Bilbao, Spain
- University of Applied Sciences and Arts in Dortmund, Germany
- National University of Construction and Architecture in Kiev, Ukraine
- Ternopil National Economic University in Ternopil, Ukraine
- Kaunas Technological University in Kaunas, Lithuania

If the master's examination has been passed, the University of Applied Sciences and Arts Dortmund awards the degree of Master of Arts (MA).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Required degree


Diplom or bachelor degree

A Bachelor or “Diplom” degree or an equivalent (the degree must be accredited) from a university of applied sciences (Fachhochschule) or a university, or the completion of a corresponding accredited bachelor qualification programme at a university of cooperative education (Berufsakademie) with an overall grade of at least “good” (2.3). It must have included for the European Master in Project Management – General Project Management (EuroMPM-G3) and (EuroMPM-G4) relevant competences in the areas of Business Science and/or Project Management (cf. Study and examination regulation on www.fh-dortmund.de/pruefungsordnung).

In addition, the course of study must amount to a minimum of **210 credit points (ECTS) for the EuroMPM-G-3** and **180 credit points (ECTS) for the EuroMPM-G-4**. Course programmes completed at foreign universities must also include a final thesis comparable to the course programmes at German universities with regard to the minimum quality requirements. The Expert Committee decides whether equivalence is demonstrated.

Proof of English language skills

Evidence of sufficient English skills provided by a *TOEFL-ITP* test with at least 550 points or a *TOEFL-iBT* test amounting to a minimum of 90 points passed within the two years before the application was submitted. The evidence may also be provided by other test methods equivalent to the TOEFL test (e.g. IELTS with at



least 6.5 points) or by equivalent credit points and examination results. In exceptional cases the evidence can be submitted by means of an equivalent certificate or test results demonstrating the relevant minimum requirements (equivalent to C1 of the *Common European Framework of Reference for Languages* (CEFR)). The Expert Committee decides whether equivalence is demonstrated.

Pre-Check Form

In order to be able to verify before the application whether you meet the requirements for admission to the programme all applicants (EU, German, non-EU) are highly recommended to send us their documents for a pre-check to eurompm@fh-dortmund.de.

Therefore, please send one PDF containing your bachelor's certificate and transcripts, your CV, your language certificates and the filled out form sheet. After the pre-check you will be provided with instructions and a link to the online portal.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

The degree programme starts every winter semester. The courses are offered every year. University places are allocated by the University of Applied Sciences and Arts Dortmund. Admission to the master's programme European Master in Project Management is restricted. Applications for the winter semester have to be submitted by the 15th July (cut-off period) of each year.

EU-nationals and with EU-nationals equated

EU-nationals and with EU-nationals equated, meaning:

- EU-nationals,
- Non-EU nationals who have obtained their university entrance qualification within the EU or Liechtenstein, Norway or Iceland,
- Members of the European Economic Area (EEA): Norway, Liechtenstein and Iceland,
- Non-EU nationals who live in Germany and married to an EU- or EEA-national who are working in Germany, or
- Non-EU nationals who live in Germany and have a parent who is EU- or EEA-national and has worked or work in Germany,
